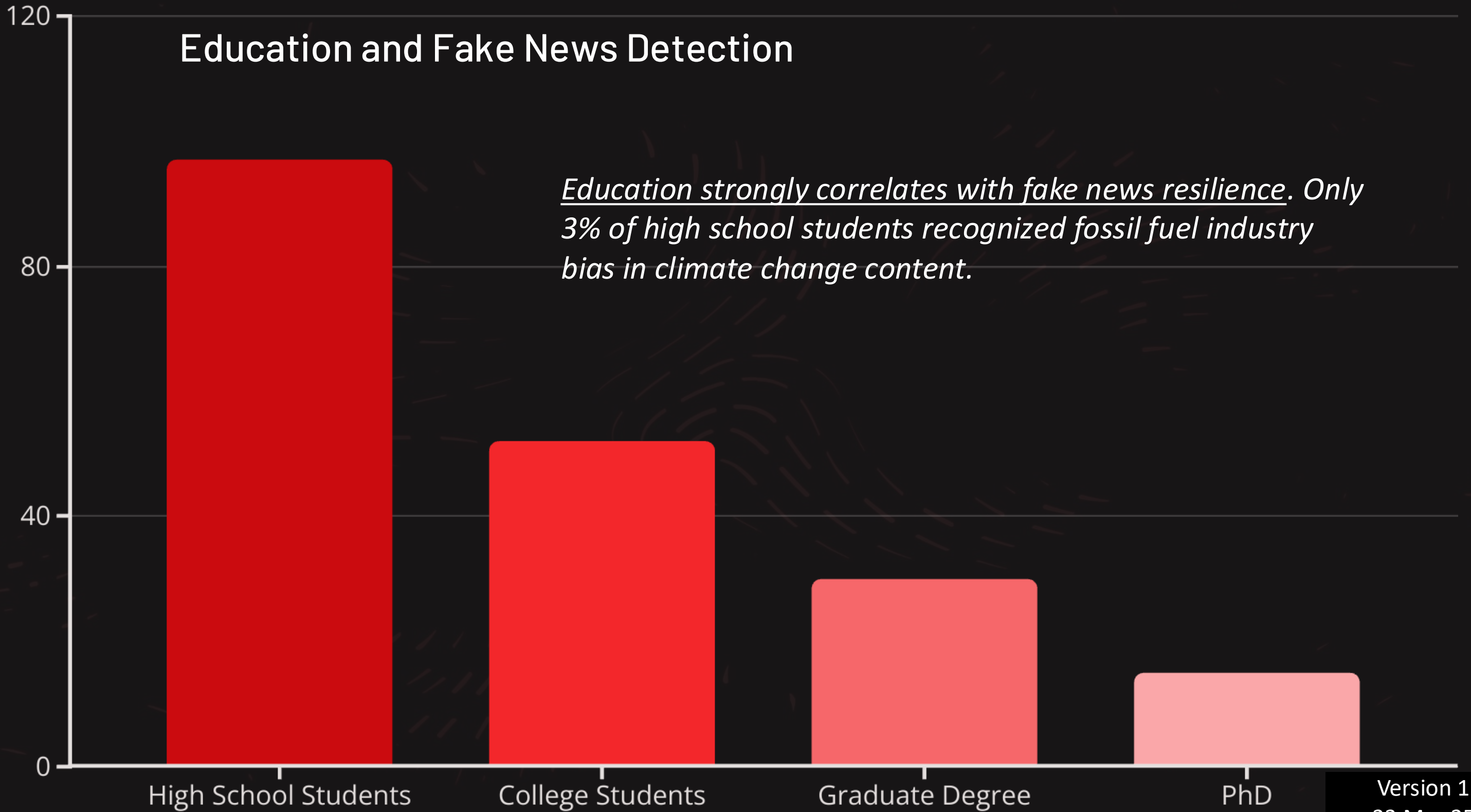

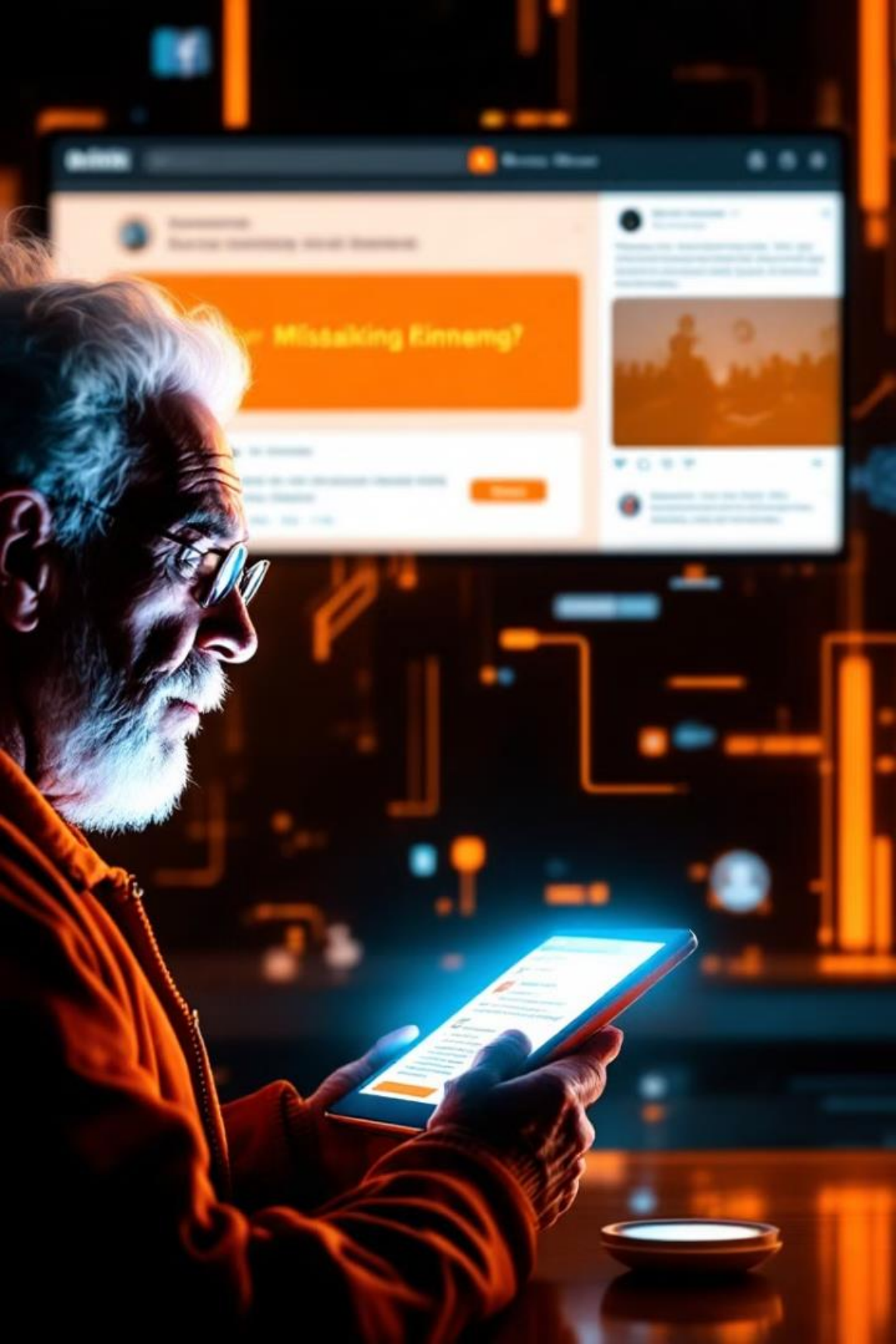

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Education and Fake News Detection

Education strongly correlates with fake news resilience. Only 3% of high school students recognized fossil fuel industry bias in climate change content.

Older Adults

More likely to share fake news accidentally



Sleep Deprivation

35% of adults suffer, impairing critical thinking



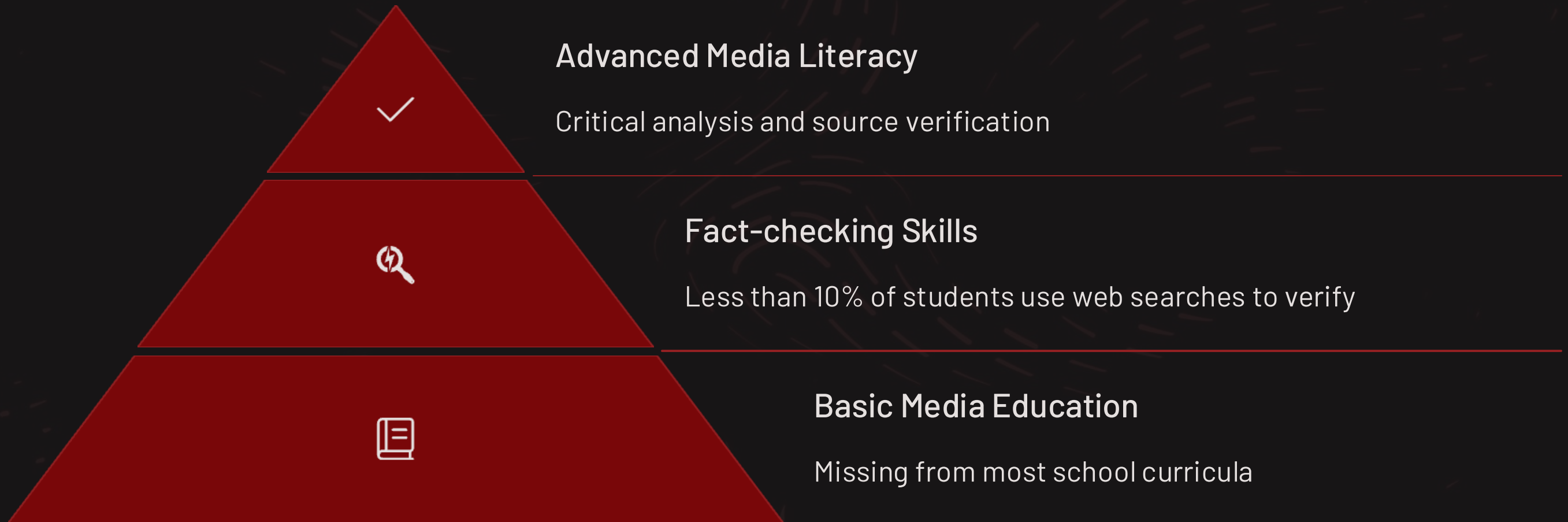
Younger Users

Consequences of Fake News Vulnerability



Cognitive Impairment

24 hours without sleep equals 0.08% blood alcohol level in mental functioning.

Emotional Impact

Anxiety increases 30% with sleep loss, affecting information processing and judgment.

Decision-Making

Reaction times slow 300% when tired, leading to hasty conclusions and poor source evaluation.



Addressing the Education Gap

School Integration

Implement comprehensive media literacy programs in K-12 education.

Critical Thinking

Teach source evaluation and fact-checking as core skills.

Lifelong Learning

Develop digital literacy programs for all ages, especially vulnerable populations.

Policy Reform

Advocate for education standards that address modern information challenges.
